



B.C.'s Clean Energy Act (CEA)

Introduced in 2010

 The bill was introduced to promote energy self-sufficiency, independent power production and reductions in greenhouse gas emissions.

Amended in 2012

 The B.C. Government announced the "Greenhouse Gas Reduction (Clean Energy) Regulation" as part of an amendment to Section 18 of the CEA, to encourage the adoption of natural gas as a transportation fuel in B.C.



Section 18: Policy Shift in British Columbia

The BC Government authorized public utilities to take a leadership role in developing the NGT market.

Key elements include:

- Up to \$62 million in vehicle incentives
- Up to \$42 million in station investments


